Second Sunday of Advent Year B


The 2nd letter of Peter, ch3 8-14, serves as a profound reminder for the faithful during the season of Advent. Peter emphasises the timeless nature of God, reminding us that "with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day." This passage invites us to reflect on the nature of our waiting during Advent. Often, we are impatient in our waiting, expecting quick answers and immediate gratifications. However, Peter's words encourage us to adopt a divine perspective on time, one that values patient, steadfast waiting. This patience is not passive but active; it's a time of preparation and growth, mirroring the long wait of humanity for the Messiah. This period of waiting is not just about looking forward, but also about examining our present – how we live, act, and interact with others. It's a reminder that every moment is an opportunity to embody the values of the kingdom, to be "found by him at peace, without spot or blemish," as Peter exhorts. It is a call to personal and communal purification, a recommitment to our baptismal promises. On this 2nd Sunday of Advent, let us embrace this call to purity and peace, preparing ourselves to celebrate the coming of Christ with hearts renewed and lives transformed by His grace.
