In the Gospel this week, Mark 12:38-44, the story of the widow's mite shows a different kind of bravery. The widow gives all she has, even though it means she will have nothing left. Her sacrifice is real and comes from her deep trust in God.

Unlike the scribes, the widow does not gain any honour from her actions. No one notices her but Jesus. Her faith and trust are pure, and her sacrifice shows her deep love for God.

The widow's example challenges us. Are we willing to give all we have to God? Her story encourages us to trust in God's care, even when it is difficult. True sacrifice is giving without expecting anything in return. By reflecting on the stories of the widow, we can learn to live our faith more sincerely and to trust in God's promises. Let us seek to please God in all we do.
