Continuous Provision in Year 1

Continuous provision helps children in Year 1 move smoothly from play-based Reception learning into the more structured Key Stage 1 curriculum.

Why do we use it?

- Builds independence and confidence
- Allows children to practise and apply key skills
- Encourages creativity, problem-solving, and teamwork
- Makes the transition from Reception smoother

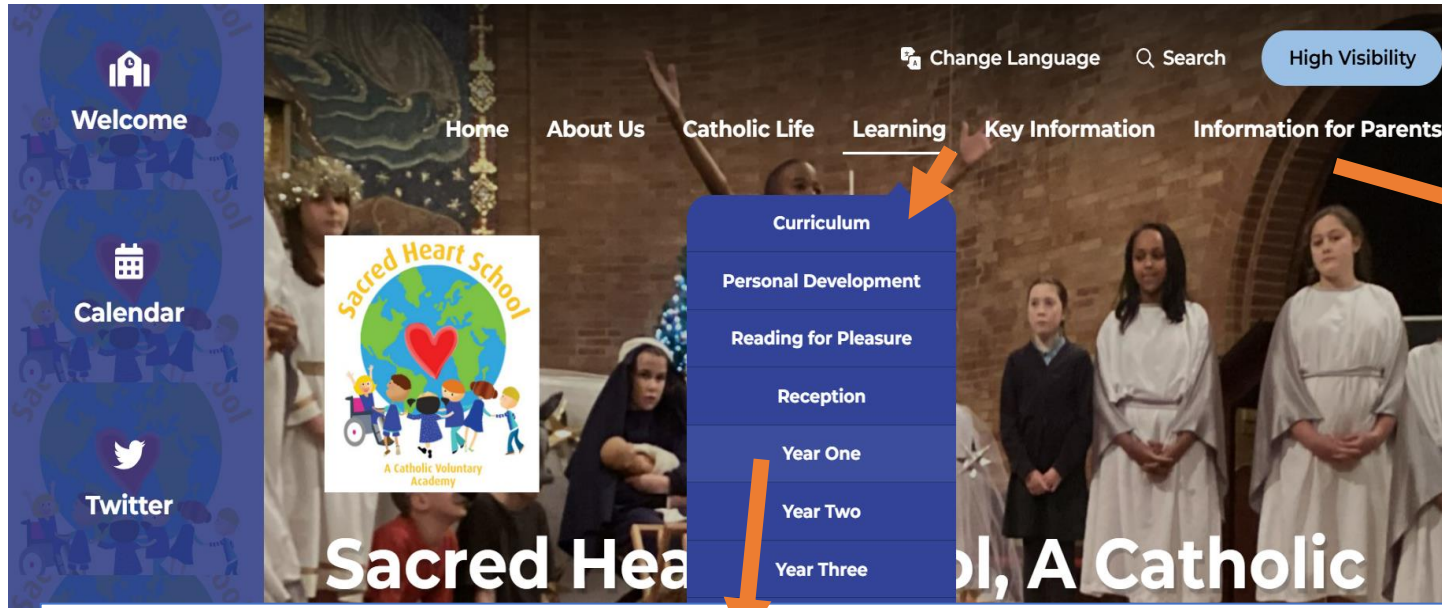
What does it look like in the classroom?

Area	What children will find
 Reading corner	Books, story props, phonics games
 Writing area	Notebooks, pencils, word mats, writing prompts
 Maths resources	Number games, counters, shapes, puzzles
 Construction & play	Blocks, Lego, toy people and animals
 Creative area	Art, craft, role-play opportunities
 Outdoor learning	Physical play, nature exploration, problem-solving

How does it help learning?

- Teachers introduce new skills in lessons
- Continuous provision allows children to practise independently
- Teachers observe and support children as they explore

Class Saint

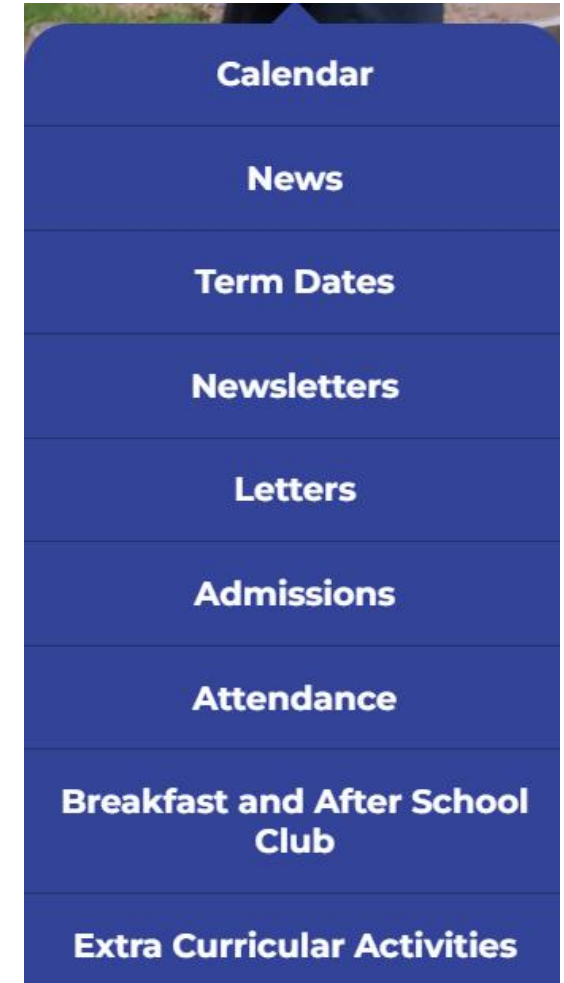


St George. Patron Saint of England. Feast day is 23rd April.
