The readings this week remind us that God’s blessings are not just for the powerful or successful. In the Beatitudes, Jesus shows that the promise made to Abraham is fulfilled in Him. God’s kingdom is different from the world. He blesses those who are poor in spirit, meek, and merciful. This is not what people usually expect. The world values power, wealth, and status. But Jesus teaches that true happiness comes from humility and trust in God. Those who suffer, seek peace, and do what is right will receive God’s blessings.

The Beatitudes call us to live in a new way. They show that God’s kingdom is for all who follow Him with a sincere heart. The readings challenge us to let go of selfish ambition and embrace the way of Christ.

God invites us to live with faith and humility. By following the Beatitudes, we find true joy in His kingdom.

I show my compassion when I am patient, understanding and loving to my neighbour.

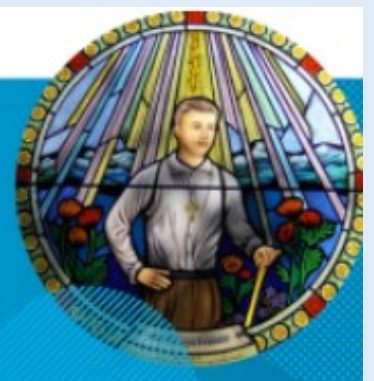
